Immigration Status and Pay Documentation: Findings from the 2008 Unregulated Work Survey

The 2008 Unregulated Work Survey is a statistically reliable sample of 4,387 workers in low-wage industries and occupations in Chicago, Los Angeles and New York City; 39 percent of the sample was undocumented. The survey asked detailed questions about the workers' jobs, wages and hours in the week prior to the survey (see the technical appendix of the <u>full report</u> for more details). In particular, workers were asked if they had received documentation from their employer listing their pay and tax deductions in the last pay period. The findings are as follows:
