WHEREAS, the release each year of thousands of people from prison has established reentry as a high profile issue on national, state and local policy agendas; and

WHEREAS, the ability of an ex-offender to transition to the community as a law abiding citizen is in the interest of public safety; and

WHEREAS, Wilmington City Council and the Administration are supportive of efforts that facilitate the successful re-integration into society of individuals with criminal backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, ex-offenders, particularly those recently released from prison, face significant barriers to many types of legal employment; and

WHEREAS, studies indicate that stable employment is one of the best predictors of post-release success; and

WHEREAS, introduced July 26, 2012, H. R. 6220: Ban the Box Act, is federal legislation aimed to prohibit an employer from inquiring whether an applicant for employment has been convicted of a criminal offense, except in certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, several major U. S. cities and counties including Atlanta, Baltimore, Chicago, Philadelphia, Richmond and Seattle, have adopted their own "Ban the Box" fair
