DECLARATION OF ETHEL DEMARY

Ethel DeMary hereby declares as follows:

- I am a home care worker in the State of Illinois' Home Services Program. I am
 years old and live in Chicago, Illinois.
- 2. I have been working in the Home Services Program since about 2010. I have provided care for the same client since I began working in the Home Services Program. The types of care I provide range from assistance with bathing, dressing, cleaning, preparing meals, grocery shopping and other errands, to accompanying her to medical appointments, medicine reminders and assisting her with treatment.
- 3. When I began working in the Home Services Program, the State automatically deducted fair-share fees from my wages to support my union representative, SEIU Healthcare Illinois & Indiana ("Union"). I had no objection to providing financial support for the Union. I believe that a strong union representative is necessary if home care workers are to be treated with the dignity and respect that we deserve. In previous jobs I've held, I've been a member of a

union and I believe that a union is important because it provides security and support for workers. I believe that all home care workers should pay their fair share to support the Union because all home care workers benefit from the Union's activities.

- 4. Our current Union contract provides for pay of \$13/hour for home care workers, a significant increase from when I first started, and for the State to pay into a health benefits fund and for training. I do not believe that home care workers would have achieved this without a strong Union or that we will be able to continue to improve the status of home care workers without a strong Union.
- 5. I believe the Union is important because the Union is there to assist home care workers. For example, once I had an issue with payment for attending a training class and I went to the Union for help and they helped me resolve the issue. I have attended all of the training classes and I believe they are very useful. I believe I have learned to be a better home care worker because of the classes, and am now better prepared to care for clients with different conditions. Not only do I learn from the instructors, but I also get the chance to learn from my fellow home care workers and their experiences.
- 6. When I first started working in the Home Services Program I was not familiar with everything our Union does and with the importance of becoming a Union member. In about April of 2011, I attended a meeting and after I learned more about the Union and the benefits it provides, I decided to join as a member and have remained a Union member ever since.
- 7. I do not support the Harris v. Quinn lawsuit or the goal of the National Right to Work Legal Defense Fund to weaken our Union. I do not believe the named plaintiffs speak for me or represent me. I am grateful to the Union for advocating on behalf of home care workers and our consumers.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the United States that the foregoing is true and correct.
