DECLARATION OF KAREN STRICKLAND

Karen Strickland hereby declares as follows:

- 1. I am a housekeeper at St. Bernard Hospital. I was a home care worker in the State of Illinois' Home Services Program on and off from about 2007 until 2009. I am 44 years old and live in Chicago, Illinois.
- 2. When I worked in the Home Services Program, I cared for one consumer who was not related to me.
- 3. When I worked in the Home Services Program, the State automatically deducted fair-share fees from my wages to support my union representative, SEIU Healthcare Illinois & Indiana ("Union"). I had no objection to providing financial support for the Union. At the time, I was already a member of the Union through my work at St. Bernard Hospital, so I knew that the fees were going to be spent well. I believe that a strong union representative is necessary if home care workers are to be treated with dignity and respect. I believe that all home care

workers should pay their fair share to support the Union because all home care workers benefit from the Union's activities.

4. I worked in the Home Services Program as a second job to my work at St.

Bernard. The wages I made were very helpful and enabled me to pay for transportation and for

clothing. Even though I worked part time and on and off, I believe the wage increase was

helpful. I do not believe that home care workers would have achieved the gains they've made in

terms of wage increases, benefits, and funding for training without a strong Union or that home

care workers will be able to continue to improve their status without a strong Union.

5. I never joined the Union as a home care worker in the Home Services Program,

because I was already a member through my job at the hospital. However, I willingly paid fair

share fees because I know how important the Union is, and I never opposed or object to paying

those fees to the Union.

6. I do not support the Harris v. Quinn lawsuit or the goal of the National Right to

Work Legal Defense Fund to weaken our Union. I do not believe the named plaintiffs speak for

me or represent me. I wouldn't want the fees I paid back from the Union because I support my

Union 100% and I think it's important to financially support the Union.
