

How Much Do New York's Workers Need? At Least \$15 per hour - Both Upstate and Down

Do workers in New York really need \$15 per hour? Opponents of Governor Cuomo's proposed \$15 minimum wage argue that it is excessive – especially for upstate communities where living costs are lower. However, analysis of regional living costs across New York State shows that by 2021, even in the most affordable upstate regions, a single worker will need at least \$15 per just to afford the basics. And workers supporting children and in the more expensive downstate regions will need even more.

The cost of living analysis presented in this fact sheet is based on the Economic Policy Institute's (EPI) *Family Budget Calculator*.¹ EPI's calculations include major expenses, such as housing, child care and health care, together with other essentials like food, clothing and transportation.

1. Basic Family Budgets and Wages Needed for Select Upstate Cities. Analysis of a basic family budget for a single worker in three representative upstate cities – Buffalo, Rochester and Syracuse – illustrates this reality. In those cities – which are among the least expensive places to live in New York State – a single worker will by 2021 need \$32,689 in Buffalo, \$33,535 in Rochester, and \$33,791 in Syracuse just to cover basic living costs at a modest level. These living costs mean that a single, full-time worker will need to earn at least \$15.72 per hour in Buffalo, \$16.12 in Rochester and \$16.25 in Syracuse by 2021 just to cover the basics.

2. Wages Needed for Basic Family Budgets Across New York State. The tables below present similar cost of living analyses for fifteen regions across the state (known as metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) and non-MSAs of New York²). They show the hourly wage that workers will need in each region by 2021 in order to earn a basic family budget for each of the following selected household types: a single adult with no children; a single parent with one child; and two parents with one child. All calculations assume that each adult works full-time; hourly wage rates are per adult in the household.

The tables show that by 2021, single adults everywhere in the state will need more than \$15 to meet basic needs – and adults in downstate regions and supporting children will need even more.
