Q1	There is a proposal in the state legislature th year to raise the minimum wage in New Hampshire. The current minimum wage for workers in New Hampshire is \$7.25 an hour, about \$15,000 a year for someone working a 40-hour work week. There is a proposal to raise the minimum wage to \$9.50 next year, \$10.75 in 2021, and \$12.00 in 2022. Would you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose or strongly oppose this proposed increase in the minimum wage?

Q6 Supporters of increasing the minimum wage say that currently in New Hampshire and throughout the country, even single workers without children need more than \$15.00 per hour just to make ends meet. Instead, the state minimum wage is stuck at just \$7.25. With more Americans relying on low-wage jobs than ever, they say we need to restore a strong minimum wage to help working families get ahead. Opponents say that raising the minimum wage hurts small businesses and causes them to cut jobs. They say that minimum-wage workers are mostly teenagers, many of them from well-off families who don't need higher wages. Having heard these arguments, let me ask you - would you strongly support, somewhat support, somewhat oppose or strongly oppose increasing the minimum wage to \$12.00 per hour?
